



EUSR - Utilities Safety Health Environmental Awareness (Gas)

Aims

The scheme is designed to ensure individuals gain a rounded appropriate level of knowledge, understanding health, safety and environmental law and their associated responsibilities. The course will equip delegates with the knowledge and skills to ensure that safety issues are managed effectively, protecting the workforce, other people and the general environment and ensuring that legal compliance is achieved.

Who Attends

SHEA Gas scheme is designed for individuals who require access to operational sites within the Gas industry, both permanent and temporary, at all levels including operatives, supervisors and management.

Course Content

The SHEA Gas scheme comprises of nine modules - modules 1-6 from SHEA Core and Modules 14, 15 and 16 specific to the UK gas industry.

- Module 1: Understanding our workplace responsibilities (CORE)
- Module 2: Understanding the effects of our work on the working environment (CORE)
- Module 3: Identifying and controlling risks (CORE)
- Module 4: Common hazards in the workplace (CORE)
- Module 5: Occupational health hazards (CORE)
- Module 6: Responding to emergencies (CORE)
- Module 14: Highway working and excavations (Gas Specific)
- Module 15: Pressure regulating installations (Gas Specific)
- Module 16: Safety in premises (Gas Specific)

Course Duration

This is a 1 day course.

Maximum Candidates

Maximum attendees: 12 candidates

Qualification Obtained

Issue of the related EUSR Gas Passport (valid 3 years) will be awarded to those persons who successfully complete the course. The EUSR Gas Passport is generally accepted as a minimum site entry requirement.

Entry Requirements

The minimum entry requirement is a good understanding of spoken and written English.
